



# Advisory Committee Roles and Responsibilities

## Colorado Campus Compact Advisory Committee Purpose

As a membership organization, Colorado Campus Compact depends upon collaboration with participating campuses to ensure that programs and services are relevant and align with campus priorities. The CCC Advisory Committee (AdCom) will serve as a guiding voice for Colorado Campus Compact programming.

## AdCom Membership

One or two representatives from each campus will serve on AdCom. Members will serve as stewards of service learning and civic engagement on each respective campus and/or represent a student and/or academic affairs' department. AdCom will meet two times per year where members will be asked to provide feedback on CCC programs, and participate in and provide professional development for the group.

## AdCom Activities and Expectations

CCC Advisory Committee members will:

- a) provide critical and constructive feedback to CCC staff and the Executive Committee on programs and strategic directions;
- b) commit to serving a two year term on the general Advisory Committee and attend two AdCom meetings per year; and commit to serving on an AdCom sub-committee as needed (i.e. training development, state-wide conference planning, faculty and student excellence awards, etc.); terms on AdCom are renewable;
- c) act as liaisons between CCC and their campus by distributing program information to appropriate campus constituencies, and encouraging and supporting campus participation in programs; and
- d) share best practices, challenges and successes in roles as campus/community relationship builders with other CCC member campuses and stakeholders.
